

Fulfilling our Mission Strategically

THE PROCESS - On March 5th, 2020, members and staff of the Bryan Area Foundation, along with OnPointe consulting gathered with the objective to design a roadmap for the Bryan Area Foundation's continued growth, success, and strategic development over the next three years. Post retreat, a strategic planning committee assembled, working alongside Foundation staff to review and refine the intel gathered. The refinement continued throughout the spring and summer and culminated in the creation of a strategic plan with intended outcomes identified, along with the projects, action items, and timeline required to achieve the objectives. The 2021-2023 Strategic Plan was approved by the Foundation Trustees on September 10, 2020 and presented to Foundation Members in October 2020.

THE PLAN - The Bryan Area Foundation Strategic Plan has a key theme woven throughout the various projects, and that theme is <u>to be proactive in fulfilling our mission</u> to "enhance the quality of life for all citizens of our area now and for generations to come by building community endowment, addressing needs through grant making, and serving as a leader, catalyst, and resource for charitable giving."

THE OUTCOME - The projects completed throughout the course of this fiscal year have all been done with this *proactive* lens in mind. Examples of this include our 25% "Meet your

Match" Community Fund Matching Campaign, which to date has initiated 12 NEW Community Funds, shifted 5 Acorn Funds into fully funded status, and has raised over \$160,000 in Community Fund donations. We also initiated the Williams County High Five to Thrive campaign aimed at increasing positivity and community despite the pandemic and the dark months of winter. This campaign was well received, as evidenced by the "high fives" that could be seen hanging up in Williams County businesses and schools. This spring, we added a new Founder's Grant program for grant requests up to \$2,500 with an expedited and simplified application process, and to date, 10 Founder's Grants have been awarded, with three of the recipients being brand new to applying to the Foundation. We also established a new "Community Impact" committee with the sole purpose of *proactively* seeking ways to enhance and improve the quality of life in our community, and we are just getting started!

As we continue to work on our strategic plan, you can expect to see more evidence of our conscious decision to *proactively* fulfill our mission to enhance, build, serve, and give.

Total Scholarships \$227,400

This year a total of \$227,400 was granted in new scholarships. Bryan students received \$121,500, Montpelier students \$38,000, Edon students \$25,700, West Unity students \$7,750, and another \$34,450 was awarded to students county-wide. In total, 142 scholarships were awarded through the Bryan Area Foundation and its affiliates in 2021.

Operation Lifesaver is a national nonprofit whose goal is to reduce/eliminate all rail related incidents through rail safety education. Ohio is the fifth busiest rail state in the country with 5,700 crossings and approximately 5,000 miles of railroad tracks. Williams County is one of the busiest rail lines with over 80 trains a day.

The Founders grant application has been abbreviated from our traditional grant application as a means of simplifying and expediting the application process for nonprofits seeking funds for smaller (yet still impactful) projects and programs. Founders grants follow the same deadlines for submission and include the same eligibility requirements.
