Highlights from our programs/projects this past year include:

- Fun(d) Friday social media posts featuring Bryan Area Foundation Community fun(d)s provided an inside look at the donors and their stories that make up the Bryan Area Foundation. We will continue to build on these posts in the coming year!
- Wheelchair Motocross athlete Aaron 'Wheelz' Fotheringham gave an exhilarating talk
 to students about accepting people with different abilities and overcoming obstacles. This
 school assembly also introduced Bryan area pupils to the future Lincoln Park Inclusive
 Playground and kicked off the fundraising efforts for the Lincoln Park Inclusive
 Playground Project Fund.
- Jim Tressel, former Ohio State Football Coach, and Bowl Championship Series National Champion and Fiesta Bowl Most Valuable Player Mike Doss, spoke at the Bryan Arts and Education Auditorium discussing the thrilling lessons they learned on the field, and how they transfer to everyday success in life.
- Robert (Bob) Rowan, Air Force veteran and 72-year Bryan, Ohio resident, received the
 2022 Bryan Area Foundation Good Citizen of the Year award.
- The Foundation created and distributed student designed "Let's Play Together"
 greeting cards in exchange for donations made to the Inclusive Playground Project
 Fund during the Christkindl Market of Bryan, of which the Bryan Area Foundation once
 again served as the presenting sponsor.
- We developed and launched www.visitbryanohio.com as an avenue for developing an online presence with the intention to share our "sweet life" with others in the hopes that they will see that Bryan is a great place to visit, and an even better place to live!
- Our Parklet returned to the square with a new accessibility ramp, creating a vibrant community space for gathering outdoors.
- A new Memorial Scholarship Video honoring loved ones lost debuted at the annual Bryan Scholarship Awards night.
- Project Next, the newest giving circle of the Foundation, hosted its first annual golf outing to raise additional funds and the group sponsored the Simon & Garfunkel Tribute concert at the Fountain City Amphitheater to increase awareness and invite new members.

Even as our fiscal year ends, the fun goes on for the Bryan Area Foundation as we continue to build better communities and enhance the quality of life for all.

The Bryan Area Foundation fulfills its mission through the generosity of donors, and this past year we were honored to collaborate with donors to establish seventeen new endowed funds. One of our donors, JoNell Gotshall, started four new endowed funds, each with a unique purpose and intent. Affiliate Foundations unite to explore outdoor fun and recreation!

The Bryan Area Foundation, Montpelier Area Foundation, and Millcreek-West Unity Foundation worked collaboratively to financially support an engineering study for the Wabash Cannonball Trail. Once the study is complete, the Friends of Montpelier Parks intends to apply for grants and capital funding to pay for the paving of the trail from County Road 13 to the Fulton County line. east of West Unity. Improving the Wabash Cannonball Trail would give Williams County a safe and well-maintained outdoor space for walking, biking, and equestrian use. It would also provide an economic benefit for the region. Realizing the significance of paving the trail, all three Foundations contributed to funding the study giving \$10,000 in total to bring it to fruition.
